## **FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 2000**

I refer to our previous correspondence concerning the operator licence held by J A Hutchinson and Sons (Haulage) Limited, and their use of land at Stibbington as an operating centre. For ease of reference, I will deal with the points you have raised in the same order as your email of 27<sup>th</sup> November 2006.

Q1) When was the licence issued?

A1) The current Stibbington operating centre authorisation on this licence of 25 vehicles and 50 trailers was approved in 1993. However it is evident from the records held by VOSA that the licence was in force during 1988.

Q2) What area of land is covered by the licence?

A2) We do not hold a plan of the operating centre

Q3) How many vehicles are covered by the licence?

A3) 50 vehicles and 100 trailers are authorised on the licence. The operating centre at Stibbington is authorised for 25 vehicles and 50 trailers.

Q4) What if any limits are there on operating hours?

A4) There are no conditions/limits attached to the licence or operating centre

Q5) When is the O Licence due to be renewed?

A5) The licence is due for review in May 2008. Continuous licensing was introduced following legislative changes in 1995. If a current licence has no

changes or amendments to it at the review date, a licence will be 'continued' on receipt of a signed declaration and payment of the relevant fees.

The Information Commissioner can consider complaints about any aspect of the way in which requests for information have been handled. Please note: the Information Commissioner would be unlikely to consider your complaint if you have not first requested an internal review.
